Dr. Matthew (Matt) is a broadly trained anthropological archaeologist with a specialization in the Holocene archaeology of Eastern Africa. For over 25 years he has carried out anthropological research in Eastern Africa, with a particular focus on the archaeology of Ethiopia and Eritrea. He is a former Fulbright fellow and National Science Foundation grant awardee, the author of numerous scholarly publications concerning the archaeology of the



Horn of Africa, an executive board member of the Society of Africanist Archaeologists (SAfA), and founder and director of Eastern African Archaeology Online. Dr. Curtis has directed archaeological survey and excavations on the Asmara Plateau of Eritrea and the Gamo Highlands of Southern Ethiopia, conducted artifact analyses in the National Museums of Kenya, and led a regional archaeological survey project in Tigray, Ethiopia for the Cotsen Institute of Archaeology at the University of California, Los Angeles. Matt teaches anthropology at California State University, Channel Islands and previously has served on the faculty at the University of California, Santa Barbara, UCLA Extension, and the University of Asmara in Eritrea..
